What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to **provide services and goods, including delivery**: [Note: we will only collect the types of information that are relevant to the service being provided]

- Names and contact details
- Addresses
- Purchase or account history
- Payment details (including card or bank information for transfers and direct debits)
- Health information (including dietary requirements, allergies and health conditions) – only where relevant to an application for individual grants
- Account information
- Website user information (including user journeys and cookie tracking)

- Photographs or video recordings
- Records of meetings and decisions
- Identification documents
- Information relating to compliments or complaints
- Information relating to sponsorship

We also collect or use the following information to **provide services and goods, including delivery:**

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Health information

We collect or use the following information to **prevent crime, prosecute offenders, or defend against legal action:**

- Names and contact information
- Customer or client accounts and records
- Financial transaction information

We collect or use the following information to **comply with legal requirements:**

- Identification documents
- Financial transaction information

We collect or use the following information for **recruitment purposes:**

- Contact details (eg name, address, telephone number or personal email address)
- Date of birth
- National Insurance number
- Copies of passports or other photo ID
- Employment history (eg job application, employment references or secondary employment)

- Education history (eg qualifications)
- Right to work information
- Details of any criminal convictions (eg Disclosure Barring Service (DBS), Access NI or Disclosure Scotland checks)

Lawful bases

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to **provide services and goods** are:

- Consent
- Contract
- Legal obligation
- Legitimate interest:
 - We collect personal information from publicly available sources to identify people and organisations whose values and interests are likely to align with our charity's purpose where we may be able to assist their philanthropic or charitable giving intentions.
 - We collect personal information from publicly available sources to identify people connected with Charitable Trusts and Organisations who may be interested in our Charitable Trusts or Corporate networking.
 - We collect personal information from people connected to charities or other organisations who would potentially be eligible for our funding.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for **legal requirements** are:

Where we get personal information from

- Third parties:
 - Third party referrers to our individual crisis grant programmes who only provide information to us on the basis of consent from the applicant

How long we keep information

Personal Data will be held for a maximum period of seven years from either the end of your contract with us, or where this is not relevant, from your last engagement with our services.

 - UK Community Foundations or Donors/Fund holders when required for the administration of grant programmes. Grant applicants are advised at application stage who their information may be shared with, which will be determined by the fund to which they are applying.

Your data protection rights

Under data protection law, you have rights including:

Your right of access - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal data.

Your right to rectification - You have the right to ask us to rectify personal data you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.

Your right to erasure - You have the right to ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances.

Your right to restriction of processing - You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.

Your right to object to processing - You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.

Your right to data portability - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal data you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.

Your right to withdraw consent – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent.

You don't usually need to pay a fee to exercise your rights. If you make a request, we have one calendar month to respond to you.

How to complain

If you have any concerns about our use of your personal data, you can make a complaint to us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.

If you remain unhappy with how we've used your data after raising a complaint with us, you can also complain to the ICO.
